INRODUCTION TO GENETIC GENEALOGY Speaker /Member - Nancy Niles Wehner

Exhaustive searches of traditional and non-traditional records that our ancestors left behind and the application of sound analytical thought can resolve many questions of relationship encountered in genealogy. But paper trails can run cold for a variety of reasons, or provide tantalizing but inadequate information to decisively solve a relationship question. In these cases, the biological record of our ancestry that is coded in our genes may provide the final bit of information needed to prove a relationship case. Nancy will take us through the basics of DNA structure and inheritance, the types of genetic testing that are available for genealogical purposes and what each one tells us, and guide us through a case study in the use of DNA testing.

Nancy Niles Wehner is a consulting pharmaceutical toxicologist whose real love is genealogy. She has been actively engaged in genealogical research for 25+ years. In addition to work on her own and her husbands's family trees, she has done volunteer research for friends and organizations, volunteers at the Hayward Stake FHC, and is currently working on her genealogical certification.

Finding Our Grandmothers - Uncovering Maiden Names in our Family Trees

At our November meeting, we were treated to a detailed and fascinating presentation given by Janice M. Sellers, a professional genealogist, about tracing those elusive female ancestors. She gave us many less obvious places to search for those elusive maiden names, from marriage banns (traditional church announcements made several days before the marriage) to those old-fashioned "out-of-town" newspaper items about visiting relatives. Here are some other highlights:

Divorce records: We always think about searching marriage records or land contracts, but if there was a divorce, the record will typically include the date and location of the marriage, and in most cases, the wife's maiden name.

F.A.N. Club: Friends, Associates, Neighbors (FANs) often moved together from the old country, so when looking at census records, clues to maiden names may come from others on the same street as your ancestor who marrried into the family. Speaking of census records, don't forget that many elderly parents or other family members lived with their daughters, so a clue to a maiden name may come from this source.

Death records of children: In some families the mother's maiden name is used as a middle name for children, which may appear either on the death records, or in grandchildren's death records.

Fun Fact: Janice, whose business is called Ancestral Discoveries, mentioned a researcher named Marian L. Smith who found that immigrant's names were not distorted or changed at Ellis Island, though one's ancestors may have changed the family name themselves after arriving in the country. Smith's research determined that not only were newcomers required to have identity cards or other documentation from their home countries upon entry, many of the inspectors were themselves immigrants and translators were available, in any case. This can open up an entire new area of research for those of you who assumed the original name was lost upon entry to the country. Reach Janice M. ITEMS OF INTEREST

"Diablo Descendants", the newsletter of the Contra Costa County Genealogical Society publishes pages of Vital Records from 19th century issues of the Contra Costa Gazette. If your ancestors lived in Contra Costa in that time period, you may want to access their newsletters through their website and browse through back issues. Just Google them.

The Monterey County Genealogical Society prints several pages of births, marriages, deaths, and other newsy items from the Salinas Weekly Index from the late 1800's. Were any of your ancestors in Monterey County during that time period? At **www.mocogenso.org** you may browse back issues of their newsletter.

CensusGenie: A website initially geared to the 1940 census, may help you in your search for difficult to locate records and information. Some of the 'nice-to-have' search tools are: search by family size, search by ages and genders within the family (e.g., when you suspect the family name has been misspelled), search within a certain number of miles of a location (e.g., to search western PA, but not include Philadelphia), etc.

Some of the 'nice-to-have' presentations of the census images are: being able to scroll through the forms mimicking the scroll of a microfilm roll, looking at colorized images rather than black-and-white images, etc. Another 'nice-to-have' is the ability to input a modern day street address and get back a colorized map of the block and enumerating district for that address. This may be the only block-number tool available today.

COLUSA COUNTY, CALIFORNIA - A Thumbnail Sketch

One of the original counties established in 1850. At that time the population was 115 and the name was spelled "Colusi". Population of Colusa County as of the 2010 census is 21,419. The county is located northwest of Sacramento (the state capitol) in California's Central Valley.

It boasts only two incorporated cities, Colusa (the county seat) and Williams. Some of its area was given to Tehama County in 1856 and in 1891 a portion was given to Glenn County.

Also the home of Colusa County Historical Records Commission. Oversees preservation and conservation of county records of historical importance and the county records archives.
