Looking Back at June:

We did not have a very large attendance at our June meeting, but everyone seemed to be absorbed in Wade Olofson's program on Swedish Research - whether they had Swedish ancestors or not. Swedish records available online at the Family History Center Library are plentiful and rather complete. As Wade said several times, its a "one-stop shop" in many cases. Do your homework - the most important information you will need might be the county or parish from which your ancestors immigrated.

One tip he passed on that would be useful to any researcher was using **Ancestry Boards** for tough searches/questions that have eluded your efforts so far. We have donated our California Information File (an early newspaper index, etc) and the 1980-1988 California Death Index (both on microfiche) to the Oakland Library Newspaper Room.

For Best Results: When you get to the above site, click on: Ancestry Message Boards. At the bottom of that page you will find: Board Help and Board FAQ. These will help you understand the format and aid your search.

It is FREE. Give it a try when you are having a particularly difficult time finding the information you are seeking.

An Appalling Sign of the Times: The other evening I was leafing through the July/August 2014 Family Tree Magazine. Among the Letters to the Editor was one from a Sandy Lyon, Kirkland, IL. In her letter Ms. Lyon said she had recently visited a courthouse to acquire a marriage certificate for her ggg-grandparents. The certificate could be had, but the young clerk had warned her that she would not be able to read it. The reason being - it was in CURSIVE! Apparently in many school districts throughout this country today cursive writing is no longer taught or even thought to be of much importance. Therefore, present day youngsters will have difficulty reading it in years to come. The present generation of genealogists have trouble with Old English and German Script. Can you just imagine genealogists generations from now not being able to read old American documents, vital records or perhaps not even the census reports! Mind boggling and very disturbing, isn't it?

The New England Historic Genealogical Society: www.Americanancestors.org

Their website has a growing Online Learning Center that offers educational resources for guest users and NEHGS members. There is access to archived Webinars, online courses, how-to videos, subject guides and much more. (excerpted from May 2014 San Ramon Valley Genealogical Society Newsletter.)

U. C. Berkeley Libraries: The summer months are a good time to plan a visit to UC Berkeley's libraries. The Bancroft and Doe libraries have much to offer in the way of California history, manuscripts. maps, photo collections, etc. that might provide items of interest and add information to your family research. You will find the rare books and Western Jewish Americana previously held by the Judah L. Magnum Museum now available at the Bancroft Library.

The Newspaper and Microform Library (located in the basement of the Doe) is a marvelous resource. Here you will find early California newspapers, most local newspapers and The New York Times as well as newspapers from major cities throughout the states and foreign newspapers too. There are readers and copies can be made by purchasing a 'copy card' or bring your own USB/thumb drive and download your copies.

Library hours are 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday from late June through August 14, 2014. They are closed on the 4th of July and all Saturdays and Sundays.

They have recently added over 78,000 new records to their online databases. Primarily Church of Ireland (CI) baptismal records - counties Antim and Down, and Roman Catholic (RC) baptismal and marriage records of Belfast from the early 20th century.

The new records come from the following churches: Aghaderg CI, Antim CI, Ardkeen CI, Ballywalter CI, Bangor CI, Blaris CI, Carrickfergus CI, Christchurch CI, Comber CI, Donaghadee CI

Down CI, Dromore CI, Drumballyroney CI, Kilcoo CI, Kilmore CI, Magheralin CI, and St. Joseph RC and St. Patrick RC.

Western Railway Museum, Suisun, CA: Did your ancestor work on the railroad? Did your grandmother use the Key Route trains or streetcars to go shopping or visit friends and family? Are you a railroad/train enthusiast? Why not visit the Western Railway Museum in Suisun, CA during the summer...or any weekend during the year?

As a living history museum, the Western Railway Museum gives visitors the opportunity to ride authentic historic streetcars and interurban electric trains from all over California and the western United States. Streetcar rides are available every thirty minutes and there are four to five scheduled electric train rides per day on weekends plus guided tours.

If you had railroad ancestors you will also want to visit the F. M. Smith Library and Archives at the museum site. It is open the 2nd and 4th Saturday of each month from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m.

From now until Labor Day the museum is open and rides await you on Wednesday through Sunday from 10:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Located at 5848 State Hwy 12, Suisun, CA approximately about 12 miles east from Hwy 80. WHAT DID YOU SAY, BIGAMY? Things Happen....

Genealogy and family studies do sometimes "find a horse thief", as the joke goes. Family trees seem benign on paper charts until children and grandchildren correspond on the subject of "father's estate settlement".

Bigamy was not the subject of the Winch family research project's beginning, but it jumped to the top while researching Samuel Winch, Jr. and his land, marriage, and death records.

Samuel Winch, Jr. was born in Whitestown, NY. The family migrated from MA to NH and then NY, where Samuel Jr. was born in 1797. Each migration was an opportunity for the family occupation as milling sawyers. Five families were interrelated in the almost 100 years from MA, NH, NY, to Canada for 25 years, and to MN Territory in 1852 and Samuel's death in Ohio in 1875.

The first marriage to Elizabeth Mountenay near Utica, NY produced ten children, nine of which gave sworn court evidence in the 1876 Probate of Estate of their father, Samuel Winch, Jr. The first wife, "Betsy" Mountenay Winch, died after giving birth to their tenth child. The widower Samuel soon remarried in Ontario, Canada to Rosetta Dafoe. This union produced one daughter, Esther Susan. Second wife, Rosetta, soon demised and, once again, Samuel the widower with young children, several under the age of 16, chose a third wife. He married Ann Mathews in Ontario, Canada in 1849. No children were born of this union.

Samuel soon departs Canada to visit his sister, Margaret Winch Greenwood, in nearby Ohio. Sister Margaret Ann introduces brother Samuel to her widowed friend Mary Ann Dexter, widow of A. Dexter. Samuel marries Mary Ann in 1851 and he and his new wife and her small children soon move to join Samuel's family in MN Territory. There Samuel signs a U.S. Land Claim patent and settles several of his older children in Fillmore County. MN Territory. When these children are settled, Samuel and Mary Ann return to Ohio area to live for several years. The 1860-70 Census records shows the families in several states and Canada.

The aged Samuel now over 75 meets his maker in 1874 in Ohio. The Estate Probate now hits the Lake County Ohio Court. The Judge of Probate is informed that a contestant for the estate is one Ann Mathews Winch of Ontario, Canada.

The two widows and Samuel's children now begin a two-year court battle. Sworn evidence from each and every son and daughter and grandchild in several states and Canada is carefully recorded on several pages in the courthouse records. The Court ruled in 1880 Ann Mathews Winch as the legatee of Samuel's modest estate. Mary Ann Dexter Winch is awarded a small inventory of necessaries.

In the Ohio Census of 1880, widow Mary Ann is living in the home of Samuel's sister, Margaret Greenwood. In 1925 Samuel's son William wrote that reading the Painesville Probate case would identify the interconnected families It surely did, and there was Samuel the Bigamist... revealed!
